# > Report on Digital Equity Program by MBI

- Lark and Melanie attended the rural digital equity meeting. 3 represented from FHMS town. 4 in total. The other was from Boston. Many questions were asked but not many answers.
- Cost burden highest in the west.
- Discussion regarding Digital Equity Plan. Florida is partnered with other towns. Monroe, Hawley and Savoy do not have one. BRPC is active with this initiative. Cindy encouraged us to investigate. A question whether future funding will depend on having one, but for most towns with fiber, it is how to prioritize funding. For FHMS, we need internet, period.

## > Status of member towns who are looking to contract

- Florida has signed a franchise agreement with Spectrum. The franchise agreement is for video only. Spectrum build out is via RDOF funding. Future funding cannot be used on RDOF locations
- $\circ$  Savoy had a presentation by Spectrum last week. They have not signed.
